HAS 533 Communications and Group Dynamics

Assists students in understanding and improving interpersonal communication skills through structured exercises in speaking, writing and interacting. Emphasizes leadership skills in group interactions especially in the health care fields.

HAS 564 Health Information & Communications Systems

This course acquaints students with the types of information systems available in health care and their applications to health care delivery. It includes an overview of various health care networks, patient centered information systems, and imaging systems. Also presented is a review of system platforms, electronic medical records, and computer assisted instruction. Students discuss the integration of health information systems with communication systems, such as E-mail, fax, pagers and wireless telephones. Through the use of classroom demonstrations and site visits, students gain hands-on experience with several health related information and communications systems.

HAS 506 Food and Nutrition Policies: Cultural, Social and Behavioral Aspects of Nutrition

Introduces health care professionals to existing food and nutrition policies, the types of data that these policies are based on and the process by which they are developed. Offers skills needed to critically analyze the process and resulting policies, and those used in developing new policies and securing funds for such projects. **For Dietetic Interns only, unless permission given by professor.**

HAS 529 Community Health and Patient Education

Provides information on current trends in patient education program development. Emphasizes techniques used by health professionals in planning, implementing and evaluating patient education programs in hospitals and other health care organizations concerned with the educational component of patient care.

HAS 578 Leadership in Health Care

The organization of the future requires more than traditional management to remain successful and competitive in our rapidly changing world. This course will focus on the future role of the leader in the emerging society of organizations, while drawing on lessons learned from the past, in both theory and practice. The impact of leadership on the future quality of our lives, our businesses, our learning institutions and society in general, will be examined. Students will learn from first hand accounts the leaders' experiences and the different challenges facing private, public and non-profit organizations. The difference between management skills and leadership skills will be defined as well as strategies for balancing and developing each skill set.

HAS 579 Advanced Seminar in Health Policy (Persuasion and Communication)

This seminar is designed to provide students with an in-depth analysis of the principle of health policy-making. Examples from local and national policies are used as a framework for the student to develop an appreciation of the dynamics and complexities of policy making. Furthermore, it is expected that students will be able to synthesize the information gained throughout the course in order to demonstrate competencies in policy composition and dissemination.
