

OPTIONAL EVENING WORKSHOPS

WEDNESDAY, JUNE 1, 2005

Suturing – Donna Meltzer, M.D.

In this two hour workshop, learn or review basic suturing skills. Proper suturing techniques and correct supplies are essential for achieving good cosmetic results. Participants will have the opportunity to practice simple interrupted, mattress (vertical and horizontal), running, and deep buried sutures on pigs feet or chicken parts. Enrollment limited to 10.

Helping Medical Students Achieve:

The Five Microskills for Clinical Preceptors – Elza Mylona, Ph.D.

Feedback directs, motivates and rewards behavior. Literature suggests that feedback is the basis for development and career planning. Moreover, it contributes to building effective relationships and helps individuals calibrate their degree of goal accomplishment and the level of effort to reach the defined goal (Gill et. al., 1984; Irby, 1992 and 1994). This workshop will assist participants on the path of "becoming" more effective by providing them with some useful methods for clinical teaching strategies based on theory and research outcomes.

Board Review – Arnold Jaffe, Ph.D.

This session will focus on the development of test taking skills and in gaining knowledge of strategies that maximize test performance. A simulated exam situation will be part of the exercise.

THURSDAY, JUNE 2, 2005

Nasolaryngoscopy – Arnold Katz, M.D.

The anatomy of the larynx will be discussed, as well as the normal physiology and pathophysiology of voice. Examples will be present of vocal cord dysfunction and instructions will be provided as how to evaluate these findings.

Skin Biopsy – Asfaq Marghoob, M.D.

This workshop will include a short didactic lecture followed by a hands-on laboratory session. During the course the attendees should learn the indications for a biopsy and be able to select the most appropriate biopsy technique for rashes, benign and malignant tumors.

Electrocardiology (ECG) – Michael Zema, M.D.

An interesting potpourri of electrocardiograms will be presented with audience participation in diagnosis encouraged. A brief didactic discussion elucidating further the concepts to be learned will follow each case.

FRIDAY, JUNE 3, 2005

Nail Procedures – Daniel Jeran, D.P.M.

This workshop will address the identification of common nail pathology, diagnostic techniques available, and treatment of various diseases including medical and surgical treatments.

Pulmonary Function Testing - Ira Rezak, M.D.

This workshop will consist of a didactic discussion on the methods of pulmonary function testing and interpretation in the office setting followed by a hands-on session using common office type spirometers.

Musculoskeletal Exam of the Shoulder and Knee – Edward Wang, M.D.

Review exam techniques to be used in the outpatient setting for diagnosing problems of the shoulder and knee.

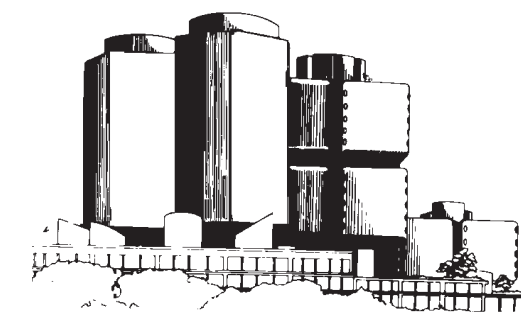

- identify problems failing to respond to management as anticipated and necessitating consultation to confirm the diagnosis and/or plan management, as well as those conditions requiring referral for definitive care.
